

### **Paul's Ponderings The Chapel Chimes** April, 2021

Our Chapel was struggling to find a way to be the church without worshipping and meeting and praying and eating together. No one could find toilet paper or Lysol wipes unless you were the one who had greedily hoarded them all. Face masks were a novelty and everyone was sure that we would be back to church by the Summer and back to school by the Fall.

What a difference a year makes! Now we have face masks to match our outfits or our favorite sports teams. We are all suffering from Zoom fatique. We've seen the development of online learning for our children and we have survived shutdowns, second, third, and fourth waves of viral outbreak, and premature reopenings that defied our best scientific advise. And, we've seen gatherings in large groups for holidays, and parties, and even church services, simply because individual freedom was valued as more important than community health. ### President's Report (Dick Van Horne)

- At their March meeting, the Board has voted to delay opening the Sanctuary for worship until at least May 1st.
- The Board has formed a committee to develop protocols for opening-up the Fellowship Hall to outside groups. They will be meeting in April to discuss the issue and submit a recommendation for Board approval.
- Many thanks to all who continue to support the Chapel with your Time, Talent and Treasure.

# Building & Grounds Report (Mike Barry, Bart Reuter, Dick Van Horne)

- Gutters were installed on the North and South side of the Sanctuary in February at a cost of \$1,148 (donation). The gutters will help mitigate our underground water problem.
- At their March meeting, the Board approved a \$12,990 expenditure (donation) for improvements in the Sanctuary Sound System. John Caggiano worked with Ward Productions to provide us with video as well as audio technology.
- Special thanks to Karl Stark for helping with a recent smoke detector issue and for volunteering with the setup and take-down of our Christmas decorations.

# Finance Team Report (Dick Van Horne, Sue Barry, George Norman, Nancy Letter, Chris Beck)

- Treasurer Sue Barry provides the team with updated Budget and Balance Sheet figures each month. The Chapel is on budget through the month of February. Current liquid assets stand at \$276,731. Part of our liquid assets is the Schwab Investment Account. The current balance is \$64,356, an excellent return on our original investment of \$50,000
- In 2020, the Chapel received a payroll protection plan loan of \$25,400. It was used to support employee payroll during the pandemic. After fully complying to terms of the federal legislation, the Chapel's loan was forgiven in early 2021.

In the near future, we are going to have the two Columbariums, in the front courtyard, cap sealed with a special sealer to prevent water leakage into the niches.

John Zoppi Construction is going to preform this task with a proven process that he has used for many years. It comes with a 15 year warranty and can be recoated if necessary.

With the coming of better weather, we will be repairing one of the water wells at the Cemetery so we can have running water to pressure wash the Cemetery Columbarium and seal it. And also, finish repairing the gazebo and staining it.
