Paul's Ponderings The Chapel Chimes June 2021

This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends because I have made known to vou everything that I have heard from my Father. John 15:12-15

"I do not call you servants," Jesus said, "but I have called you friends."

Imagine how Jesus' closest followers must have felt when they heard those words come out of Jesus' mouth for the first time. They had shared so much together. They had been through so much together. They had learned so much from Jesus and had grown so close to him. They had begun to believe that he was a great rabbi, a spiritual healer, a contemplative mystic, a Jewish prophet...perhaps, the Son of God. Surely, this man knew and loved God more intimately than anyone they had ever known before. And, now, this man of faith was claiming all of them as his friends. Astounding!

Through Jesus they were learning of God's longing to be in relationship with humankind...God's desire for communion and friendship with God's people. They had heard this story before in the Jewish tradition, those who were more than servants but actual friends with God. Abraham, Moses, Ruth, Naomi, and Esther were all more than servants of God.

Now Jesus is saying, "I have called you friends," not just special people of the past whose names and stories are recorded in sacred memory, but to a bunch of fishermen and women who came to hear his tales. They were not to be considered slaves, not even servants, but friends of Jesus...friends of God.

Through this story we come to understand that Jesus calls us friends. Church historian, Diana Butler Bass says that Jesus calls us friends and through Christ God reaches toward us, not as a fearsome master or judge, but a friend, beckoning us into God's love. Once we were created by the hand of God and now that same

Worship Team Chiming In...

After many meetings and much discussion, your Worship Team developed a plan to open the Chapel according to the CDC protocols and NC regulations. After we received Board approval, our plan was to gradually send out Constant Contact, informing you of this plan.

Surprise!! What we knew would happen at some point occurred last week when the CDC and the Governor announced all those who received their both vaccinations and it has been least two weeks, could now be mask-free. As a church, they said we could now open our doors to services. So your Worship Team met in emergency session and, after much discussion, sent our recommendations to the Board who on Tuesday, in another emergency meeting, accepted the Worship Team's proposal.

The Chapel will open on Pentecost May 23rd for worship service, with no restrictions for those who fit the CDC protocol!

We understand some of you have not received your COVID vaccinations. To keep <u>you</u> <u>safe</u> we ask you to join us, but wear a mask. If for some reason you cannot wear a mask, please call Pastor Paul and he can advise you. With our new equipment we will be able to film and stream the service live in the Fellowship Hall and on ZOOM.

All of the above means you don't have to register, or wear a mask, enter through Fellowship Hall doors, or stand in line six feet apart, or avoid hugging or shaking hands with friends before being directed to a specified seat six feet apart from anyone but a family member!

It will be Sunday at the Chapel! You can enter the Sanctuary, sit where you are most comfortable, sing hymns along with your friends, drop your special 'Thank You' to God contribution in the collection plate and enjoy the return to Sunday Worship as usual.

Looking forward to seeing you on Pentecost wearing red in celebration of the day and the re-opening of the Chapel in the Pines...a new day for us all! Remember...Sunday Worship Service will be available on three sites: the Sanctuary, the Fellowship Hall and ZOOM.

In the month of June, when we celebrate Father's Day, not a holy day but a Hallmark holiday, as I've heard it said, we pause to remember all those who have been a father to us, biologically, in mentor roles, as guides and encouragers, protectors and providers. In celebration of the importance of fathers, a hymn that comes to mind is "Children of the Heavenly Father," by Caroline Sandell-Berg, said to be the Fanny Crosby of Sweden.

Caroline was always close to her father growing up, and he insisted she have an extensive education far beyond what was traditional for girls in Sweden during the 1800s. She began writing poetry as a child and in her lifetime wrote close to 1500 poems, some of which were set to music. The two best known are "Day by Day," and "Children of the Heavenly Father," both of which are said to have been inspired and composed after witnessing her father's tragic drowning death when he fell from a boat crossing a lake in Sweden. Even though she had lost her earthly father, Caroline maintained her faith and hope in her Heavenly Father, and trusted in his guidance, love, care and protection.

In our times, the role of father is sometimes negated by the entertainment industry and other voices that question the vital role fathers play in our lives. Certainly there are plenty of stories of fathers who have not been the provider, protector, role model we need and appreciate. Fortunately, most of us experience dedicated, loving, even at times heroic fathers, who provide glimpses of the Heavenly Father Caroline Sandell-Berg wrote of, and whom we may all rely on as a Perfect Father, in our imperfect lives on this side of eternity.
