Ashes and Dust

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. It is the day that Christians of many stripes go to church for solemn prayers and to be marked with ashes on their foreheads as a symbol of repentance, but most importantly, a reminder of their mortality. As this ancient ritual is carried out the minister will say to each person, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

As a Chapel Family we will observe Ash Wednesday this year on March 2nd at 5:00, and it will be the third Ash Wednesday we will have come together during the Great Pandemic. It seems to me that we have been in a perpetual Lent surrounded by days and days of ashes and dust...years of coming face to face with our mortality. Just since Christmas I have personally lost to COVID a former longtime dental patient, a personal friend, a friend of this Chapel, and a thirty-seven year old family friend who left a wife and four children...all right here in Moore County...all unvaccinated. So, right now, all I can see is that we have suffered through three long years of Lent and for me, I just don't want to think about my mortality or anyone's mortality for even another day.

You see, for over two years now that's pretty much all I've done... reflect, pray, learn needed online technology, go to meetings that revolve around protecting all of you from this deadly disease, listen to

those of you who have come to me complaining that our protocols are too lax, only to be confronted by those of you who think that all our church protocols are too strict. All the while worrying that I might die, someone I love might die, or I might unwittingly contribute to someone else dying. And, day after day hearing of folks dying alone in the hospital and seeing the sad faces of those of you who were isolated in your homes or our local assisted living facilities. Even now, every time I put on my mask I think of the deaths of over 900,000 fellow Americans and millions of people throughout the world and so the Lenten discipline of contemplating mortality seems to me like just one more global Lenten pandemic day.

God said to Adam and Eve...

"By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread until you return to the ground for out of it you were taken; you are dust and to dust you shall return."

Genesis 3:19

We came from nothing, so we shall return to nothing. This is the most frank reminder of our fleeting existence and a stark acknowledgement of our certain death. But, thanks be to God, this verse also alludes to another concept found just one chapter earlier in Genesis that does not deal with death but with new creation.

In the day that the Lord God made the earth and the heavens, when no

plant of the field was yet in the earth and no herb of the field had yet sprung up - for the Lord God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was no one to till the ground; but a stream would rise from the earth, and water the whole face of the ground - then the Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life...

Genesis 2:4-7

A spring wells up from the dusty earth and from the muddy mixture of water and dust God created living beings and breathed into them the breath of life. So, dust may be our ending, but it was also our beginning. Dust and ash are the essential elements of creation.

Somehow, in this seemingly endless season of death, dust and ash will become the matrix of new life...death will yield to resurrection. This Lenten Season let us await another spring arising from the parched ground and our renewal as God's people. Let us anticipate the renewed lives and renewed purposes for which we have been created. We've had enough of death. This Lenten Season, let us all embrace life...new life...abundant life.

A Blessing for Ash Wednesday, by Jan Richardson

All those days you felt like dust, like dirt, as if all you had to do was turn your face toward the wind and be scattered to the four corners or swept away by the smallest breath as insubstantial -Did you not know what the Holy One can do with dust? This is the day we freely say we are scorched. This is the hour we are marked

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by what has made it through the burning. This is the moment we ask for the blessing that lives within the ancient ashes that makes its home inside the soil of this sacred earth. So let us be marked not for sorrow. And let us be marked not for shame. Let us be marked not for false humility or for thinking we are less than we are but for claiming what God can do within the dust, within the dirt, within the stuff of which the world is made. and the stars that blaze in our bones, and the galaxies that spiral inside the smudge we bear.





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Lenten Schedule for March 2022

March 2 - Ash Wednesday - The Imposition of Ashes - 5:00

Scriptures: Joel 2:1-2, 12-17, Isaiah 58:1-12, Psalm 51:1-17, and Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21 **Message**: Righteousness

Theme: The word in the gospel reading translated "piety" is the same word used in other places in the Bible that is translated "righteousness". So, we need to look at Lent as a time when we concentrate on righteousness...on doing the right thing.

March 6 - The First Sunday in Lent

Scriptures: Deuteronomy 30:11-14 (Off lectionary), Psalm 91:1-2, 9-16, Romans 10:8-13, and Luke 4:1-13 **Message**: Jesus Is Tempted...the Church Is Tempted

Theme: On the first Sunday of Lent we always hear some version of Jesus being tempted in the wilderness by Satan. The church is not exempt from temptation. One of the great temptations of the church has always been to turn the gospel into a neat system, clearly stating what's required of its members, and defining whose in and whose out. But, in Romans, Paul challenges us to give this attitude up for Lent.

March 13 - The Second Sunday in Lent

Scriptures: Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18, Psalm 27, Philippians 3:17-4:1, and Luke 13:31-35 **Message**: Hens, Foxes, and Tears

Theme: Perhaps the "enemies of the cross" that Paul speaks of are not those who hate Jesus or hate the church, but those that demand that Jesus be less sacrificial and more powerful and triumphant and provide more protection for us than the wings of a mother hen. Perhaps the "enemies of the cross are not those outside the church but those inside the church who desire a powerful and conquering God...those that desire a fox rather than a hen...and this brings Jesus to tears.

March 20 - The Third Sunday in Lent - Holy Communion

Scriptures: Isaiah 55:1-9 and Psalm 63:1-8 **Message**: The Hunger Within

Theme: We have a hunger within that we try to satisfy by accumulating things. Yet, we are called to live in an alternative economy...one where God provides an abundance of gifts and teaches that every gift is given to us to be given away. Isaiah is calling the people of Israel back to their roots of an economy based on abundance and neighborly sharing. So, we respond by gathering to practice God's economy by breaking the bread and sharing it.

March 27 - The Fourth Sunday in Lent

Scriptures: Deuteronomy 21:18-21 (off lectionary), Psalm 32, 2 Corinthians 5:16-21, sand Luke 15:1-3, 11-32 **Message**: The Prodigal Father





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Theme: Paul tells us that God has hammered out a peace treaty with humanity. It is an unusual peace treaty because one side gives up everything and the other side compromises nothing. The definition of "prodigal" is liberal or extravagant. In the Parable of the Prodigal Son, it is not really the Father who is liberal and extravagant with his forgiveness, nor either son?


Message From The Board

Team Updates

Fínance Team

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Dick Van Horne reported total liquid assets of \$295,361, of which \$68,211 was in the Schwab Investment Account. January income of \$41,832 was higher than normal, due to receipt of 2022 pledge contributions.



Building & Grounds



Chairman Dick Van Horne reported the annual fire extinguisher (9) inspection were completed, as reported by Mike Barry. A sprinkler inspection is necessary as well, to flush the system, check water flow and water pressure. The inspector will check the backflow valve and the entire system in the sprinkler room. Estimated cost of the sprinkler inspection is \$468. The expense of the inspection is normal and incidental to building/ grounds needs.

Cemetery Team

The Cemetery Team is reporting two full casket burials at the Cemetery in January, and an interment in the Columbarium. We have sold one Niche and two plots at the cemetery with no activity at the Chapel Columbarium's.

January ended the month with a positive balance of \$3,903.03 having sold two burial plots and one Niche. This balance reflects the allowance of deductions of engraving, as well as other expenses incurred.

No burials or interments are reported for February.

One Head Stone at the Cemetery was raised because it was too low and getting covered with sand.

Three boarder stones on the Columbarium wall also had to be reset to prevent falling out and breaking after becoming too lose.

Work continues on the new Columbarium at the Chapel.

What is your favorite style of music? I enjoy classical music as well at 60's music and some country.




