

Living the Story of Christ's Last Days


Inspired by the Oberammergau Passion Play

In 1632 Europe was in the middle of the Thirty-Years War, a most brutal religious and political conflict resulting in eight million deaths...one tenth of the population. While Oberammergau, Germany's remote location protected it from the war's violence, it could not isolate it from the Bubonic Plague that spread as a direct result of the unsanitary conditions created by the war. In the Sumer of 1633 eighty-four villagers would succumb to the plague...


one half of the population of the town.

The people of Oberammergau came together to pray for God's mercy so that no one else in their small village would die of the plague. Their prayers were heard and answered and in response they made a vow to God to perform a Passion Play every ten years. In 2020 over a half-million people attended the one hundred and two, six-hour performances that were acted and supported by two thousand of the five thousand residents of the village.

In the six sessions of this study we will learn of the traditions of this play, relate these traditions to the Passion story of Jesus, and consider how all this connects to our own story, our relationships with Jesus, and our desires to know the part we play in the living and ongoing story of Christ.


