Paul's Ponderings..



Ash Wednesday, 2023

By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread until you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Genesis 3:19

On Ash Wednesday we Christians go to church, pray a solemn liturgy, and are marked on the forehead with the sign of the cross made from ashes as a sign of our mortality and penitence. As the ashes are imposed the pastor says to each person, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

In the natural order of things we do indeed return to the dust of the earth...a slow decay that replenishes the soil from which new life eventually springs forth. So, perhaps we should look upon Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent that it sets in motion as a time of renewal, of rebirth, of new life instead of a reminder of death.

Church historian, Diana Butler Bass writes in her book <u>Grounded</u>, "We are animated dirt. Soil and life joined. From living grounds we were made; to living ground we will return." This is a part of what we refer to as "the

circle of life" which has been going on for eons since God first spoke creation into existence and made everything we see and everything sill invisible to us.

Perhaps this whole idea that we are made from dust and will return to dust is a shockingly beautiful concept. Dust, after all is made from exploding stars and from all the life that ever existed on earth. It carries the memories of billions of years, of immense wisdom, and of lives lived long ago. Through the dust we are connected so deeply with all that has come before and all that will ever be.

For years, along with many of you, I have perceived this idea that I will return to the dust as a sad, sad Ash Wednesday reminder but now I am amazed by it. My body is connected to ancient matter, distant stars, to all living things...we all share the same stuff.

Diana Butler-Bass continues, "The church has always emphasized this verse (Genesis 3:19) as penitence in anticipation of death. You came from nothing...you return to nothing. This is the starkest of all reminders of fleeting existence, the ever-present reminder of death. But this verse also





points in another direction - not toward death but toward creation."

Earlier in Genesis (Genesis 2:6-7) we hear these words, "...but a stream would rise from the earth, and water the whole face of the ground - then the Lord God formed man from the dust of the grounds and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being."

Dust may be our ending, but it was also our beginning. Dust and ash are reminders of our mortality and calls us to repentance, but dust is also the stuff of creation. Again, Diana Butler-Bass comments, "Deserts do bloom. Charred landscapes birth new forests.

From dust and ash come flowers and trees and fruitful fields. Dust is not nothing; ash is not nothing. Dust and ash are necessary for life."

Perhaps Ash Wednesday and the entire season of Lent is not so much about our mortality and our need for repentance as it is about renewal, new life, and rebirth. So, let us pray for that which will be reborn in our spiritual hearts and renewed in our daily lives these forty days that will bring us closer to God, to God's amazing creation, and to one another.



President's Corner

Wow a twelfth of the year is gone already. I guess time flies by even faster now.

As we move into February we have a lot going on - all of which is good for the Chapel.



As you know we have hired a Financial Secretary, Paula Montgomery, to work with Jim Beck, our new Board Treasurer. Paula and Susan will manage the day to day bookkeeping and provide the reports and details to Jim and the Board. Paula is very experienced and will be a great asset to the Chapel. Paula will be in the Chapel office on Monday afternoons so feel free to stop in and meet her.

We had our third Chapel Calé two weeks ago and it was another success. We continued to discuss the Growth Program, reviewing: "What is a Growth Program?", "Why it is necessary?" and this last Café we discussed "How do we implement a the Growth Program?" We will be summarizing all of the results from our Chapel Calé and providing them to the community in the future.

We will be having a Virtual Chapel Café as well as a fourth live Café over the next two months.

Live Streaming Is Almost Here.

As you all know, last year we finally completed the installation of our new Live Streaming equipment that will enable us to conduct broadcasts online without using the ZOOM platform. Don't get nervous. We will still be straddling the live streaming service with ZOOM before and after the service. This is wonderful news. We will be contracting with Dillon Corral, as our video and sound operator each Sunday and for other services. I will stop here and let you know there will be more information coming out about how you can use

the new streaming prior to implementing it.





For many years the subject of starting a Preschool at the Chapel has been discussed. The opportunity has really never been an option for it to become reality. Well that opportunity has now presented itself and I am excited to share it with you.

An outside person, Alison McCloskey, (Pastor Paul's daughter) approached me last fall asking if there was a possibility of renting the down stairs of the fellowship hall so she might open a preschool in Seven Lakes. She explained that there was a need in the community since the two preschools that had been operating in Seven Lakes closed during the pandemic and had not reopened, leaving families to drive into Pinehurst or Carthage for school.

We discussed the possibilities and she developed her business plan. We met again in late December and then again in early January. Her plan is to operate for the nine months of the school year, 8:00 am – 12:00 or 1:00 pm TBD. There will be no construction required and she will provide all the necessary furniture and equipment. She will rent the space for nine months, at which time it will revert back to the Chapel for the summer. I am not going further into the details.

The mission team was worried about the timing and elimination of storage space for the Rummage Sale. After discussions, they agreed to conduct the Rummage sale in early August 2024 with collection of items starting in June 2024, thus eliminating any conflicts.

It is the Boards feeling that this is good for the Chapel for several reasons. 1) It will offer a needed service to the community. 2) It will expose 30 – 40 families to the Chapel that otherwise would not come here. 3) Though the rent is not a lot, it will provide additional revenue to the Chapel.

Finance Team



The Chapel in the Pines had a successful budget performance in 2022. We are looking forward to 2023 and the Chapel Growth Program.

Building & Grounds



The plexiglass in the sanctuary bell tower is looking tired and needs replacement. Mike Barry sought two repair estimates for "insulated plate glass." Estimates included rental of a mechanical lift to reach the elevated area. The best value was a

\$4,200 estimate and the Board has approved the expenditure. Hopefully, the installation will be completed prior to March 1, 2023.

Sidewalk Replacement Project:



There is a 20ft. section of sidewalk just outside the Chapel office entrance that needs replacement. Rain water and underground seepage has caused the existing sidewalk to drop 8-10 inches over

the years. Mike Barry is seeking contractor estimates for the tearout, fill and cement installation.







Cemetery Team



We have sold 2 niches at the Cemetery and we had two interments. One has been at the Chapel and one was at the Cemetery.

We have some major repairs coming up for the Columbarium at the Cemetery from ant damage. I am not expecting a large cost for this repair.

We were investigating the cost of adding a Columbarium on to the backside of the existing Columbarium, but the cost was beyond our resources. I am now looking at putting a new Columbarium across from the existing one, that would hold many more guest than the present one.

No - wish I could!


What other activities do you enjoy?

February 2nd is one of the most ancient of Christian holy days...the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus...also called Candlemas. It commemorates the time when Joseph and Mary brought their newborn son to the Temple in Jerusalem.

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord... Luke 2:22

The purpose of the trip was Mary's purification...a cleansing ritual performed forty days after giving birth.

Upon arriving at the Temple they encountered Simeon, an elderly prophet awaiting the coming of the Messiah. Simeon took the child from them and proclaimed...

Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which

you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the gentiles and for the glory of your people Israel. Luke 2:29-32

Weeks ago Advent began with the lighting of candles in anticipation of Jesus' birth. Followed by the Nativity which is accompanied by angelic beams of light shining down on unsuspecting shepherds tending their flocks by night. Epiphany celebrates the light of a star directing the Wise Ones to the newly born King of the Jews. And, as the season following Epiphany unfolds, the light expands with the invitation to Jews and gentiles alike to simply "follow me". The final movement in the arc of light is Candlemas, where the entire world is set ablaze with God's divine/human manifestation of love.

Candlemas falls halfway between the Winter Solstice and the Spring Equinox. It is a time of lengthening days when creation begins to awaken with new life. The intersection of the Jewish story of Mary's purification, the announcement of Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah, and the seasonal return to longer and brighter days all came together to create the Christian celebration of Candlemas. So on February 2nd it became traditional for many Christians around the world to bring candles to the church to be blessed and then walk through towns and villages in candlelit processions.

The long weeks of Winter candle festivals...from Advent to Christmas to Epiphany...end with us hearing the challenge of Jesus that as his disciples we are called to bear the light of Christ into the world. The light cycle concludes with the words of Jesus that millions of Christians will hear this Sunday..."You are the light of the world."

Yes, God created the light. Jesus is the light that the darkness will never overcome. Yet, we...fragile and flawed human beings...are the light of the world. That's God's plan. It's now up to us to shine forth the light of Christ to all people.

I will praise thee, O Lord my God,
with all my heart:
and I will glorify
thy name for
evermore.
