



Let's imagine that this holistic approach to stewardship is that for which we were created by God and it's what will ultimately bring all of us the deepest sense of purpose, fulfillment, and blessing.

Our study will meet on four consecutive Thursday afternoons at 4:00 pm beginning on August 17:


August 17 The Covenant August 31 The Priority August 24 The Spheres September 7The Strategy
