Paul's Ponderings...

Pledged in Faith...Fulfilled with Joy

When we fill out a Pledge Card and a Time and Talent Sheet, we are making promises to God... vows to God...we are pledging our time, talents, and treasure to God. During our Fall Stewardship Season we made these pledges, but as this particular church season comes to a close I've been pondering what comes next. There's a story in the Old Testament surrounding a devoutly religious woman named Hannah that gives us a clue as to what comes next. You can read it for yourself in First Samuel chapter one and two, but here's my version of the tale.

Hannah really wanted to have a baby. Every year she would go with her husband to a place called Shiloh for a festival that celebrated all the things God had done for the people of Israel. They would thank God for their crops, their families, and their wellbeing and make sacrifices to show their appreciation for a generous and loving God. This event often made Hannah sad because she wanted to be thankful but was discouraged because she was unable to have a child.

So, Hannah did the only thing she knew to do. In between her tears and in broken sentences interrupted by sobbing, Hannah prayed, "Dear God, if you would only look and see how sad I am and remember me...please give me a son. If you would do that for me, I pledge to dedicate my son to you for his whole life." A

priest named Eli who was sitting nearby saw how earnestly she prayed and said, "Go in peace and may God answer your prayer."

Then Eli answered and said, Go in peace: and the God of Israel grant thee thy petition that thou hast asked of him.



In time God did bless Hannah with a son and she named him Samuel. Hannah had waited so long for this child and she loved Samuel so much but she remembered her promise to God. when Samuel was old enough she sought out the priest, Eli. you remember me," she asked Eli? I am the woman who cried and prayed for a child and God answered my prayer. Now, I will fulfill my pledge. I give my child to the Lord and I leave Samuel with you to learn and work with you."

It was so hard for Hannah to give up her child but she wanted to keep her pledge to God, so as she delivered the boy she breaks out in song. Yet, the tone of her song is not what you might expect. Hannah is triumphant. She is defiant. She is strong. She is revolutionary. She sings...

"My heart exults in the Lord; my strength is exalted in my God. My mouth derides my enemies because I rejoice in your victory. There is no Holy One like the Lord, no one besides you; there is no Rock like our God. The bows of the mighty are broken, but the feeble gird on strength."

This is no song of mourning over her loss, it is a revolutionary song of joy and thanksgiving. It is a song of loyalty to God and thanksgiving for God's blessings. Hannah pledged her son to God in faith and fulfilled her promise with joy.

So, we have brought our pledges of time, talents, and treasure to God. We have made our individual promises to God in faith, so let us now fulfill them



with joy...all the while giving thanks to God.

Oh, by the way, seeing Hannah's faithfulness God blessed her and her husband with even more sons and daughters. And, as for Samuel, he grows up to help many people in their understanding of God and ultimately he becomes one of the great leaders of the nation of Israel.

Like Hannah, we have made our pledges in faith and we will seek to fulfill them with joy. Next, we will await all the blessings that God will grant to us and to this Chapel and we will celebrate and give thanks in faith and in joy.




