The Great Thanksgiving

On this, the Second Sunday after Epiphany we lift our praises to you, O God for all the gifts you have so graciously given to us. Even before you breathed the word which tamed chaos, you named us as your children...heirs of all the goodness you desired for us.

You sang to us in Eden's fields, inviting us to glorify you forever. Yet, we walked into the shadows of the world, leaving the songs behind us. You persisted in your hopes for us, knowing that where no life is anticipated, no hope is expected, no future is seen... it is in those barren and desolate places that you gather your children up to carry us into your kingdom.

So, with angel choirs in every region, with shepherds who caroled a homeless family, with those who came home singing from exile, we lift our voices in joy and hope.
