The Prayer of Confession

Adapted from Psalm 51

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.

Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.

You desire truth in the inward being; therefore teach me wisdom in my secret heart. Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. **Restore to me the joy of your salvation**, and sustain in me a willing spirit.

O God of my salvation my tongue will sing aloud of your deliverance. O Lord, open my lips and my mouth will declare your praise.
