Paul's Ponderings...

I Was a Stranger and You Invited Me In

Each year I purchase a planning calendar specifically made for Christian pastors and church leaders. This calendar reminds me of all the important Sundays, holidays (Christian and secular), and the scriptures designated by the Revised Common Lectionary for each worship service. This past June was a busy time for Christians according to my calendar. There was The Day of Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, Father's Day, National Gun Violence Awareness Day, Juneteenth, and one that never gets much attention but perhaps this year it should...World Refugee Day.

Here's a summary of a 2024 report from the United Nations Refuge Agency.

At the end of 2024 there were 123.2 million people globally, who have been forced to flee their homes due to persecution, conflict, violence, human rights violations, or events seriously disturbing public order.

Among this group of 123.2 million people there were 42.7 million refugees. In addition there were 73.5 million people displaced within the borders of their own countries and 8.4 million asylum-seekers. There are also 4.4 million stateless people, who have been denied a nationality and lack access to basic rights such as education, health care, employment, and freedom of movement.

More than 1 in every 67 people on earth is a displaced person.

Many nations, even predominately Christian countries are becoming more and more reluctant to support immigrants and refugees. Some are restricting refugee entry, deporting immigrants at record numbers, and cutting services to the newly arrived. In many cases anti-immigrant leaders have gained or are gaining power resulting in prejudice and violence towards immigrants and refugees increasing all over the globe.

Yet, at the heart of Christianity is an ancient principle that Jesus taught...

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me. I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." -Matthew 25:35-36 People of faith may, of course, disagree about policies regarding immigration, but Christians cannot avoid Jesus' call for compassion, safety, and welcome for the strangers among us. Immigration has been central to the human story from the beginning and the problems are expected to grow worse in the coming decades. It is incumbent on all Christians to resist the dehumanization and demonization of immigrants and refugees and to never deny the clear teachings of Jesus on how we should welcome and treat the stranger.

...But this difficulty in sharing becomes an obstacle to living a true experience of community - including with our migrant brothers and sisters. We are called to share. We are called to accompany them, to welcome, protect, and promote them - fostering a real experience of community that looks beyond religion and all the other distinctions that so often divide us. - Pope Leo XIV (then Bishop Robert Prevost, 2020)

as. We have received a number of complaints. I called in a company and they reported that our Cemetery grass has a fungus called CENTIPEDEGRASS DECLINE. So to make the grass healthy again, over the next two years, we are going to PLUG (aeration) the entire cemetery, then do a four season of fertilizer and weed and crabgrass killer at the total cost of \$5140.00. After that is completed, we may have to sod an area in Section I.

In February the Men's Fellowship met along with the Mission Team to hear about this year's "Apostle Build" by Habitat for Humanity of the Sandhills in Addor, NC. It was decided that our pastor and the two teams would work together to assist with the build.

At a subsequent Habitat meeting, we volunteered to have up to 12 congregants volunteer on the dates of Thursday & Friday June 12th & 13th. Pastor Paul, volunteered for the start of the build on April 24th and 25th and up to 11 volunteers,

including Paul, worked one or both of the two days in June preparing the home for the drywall team to come in July. The "Apostle Build" project will stretch into Oct - Nov and I am sure a number of our congregants will continue to assist as the project moves to completion.




