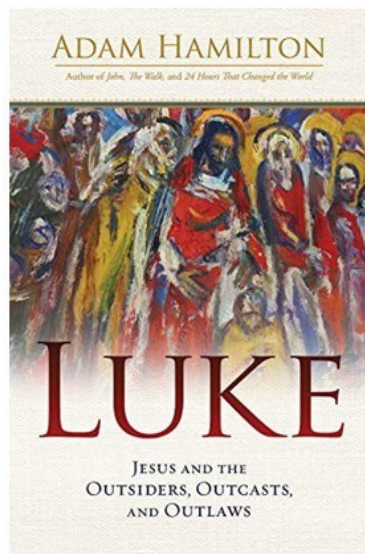

Luke; Jesus and the Outsiders, Outcasts, and Outlaws

A Bible Study of the Gospel of Luke in Six Sessions

"Jesus came to lift up the lowly. In the Gospel of Luke... we find stories of Jesus' ministry with ordinary, unexpected people. They weren't perfect. Many of them were struggling and didn't have their acts together. Some of them were outsiders or even outlaws. Whoever they were, Jesus brought the good news of God's kingdom to those who most needed to hear it. That includes you and me."

Sunday, August 3

3:30

Lifting Up the Lowly

We'll explore how God chose and used both the infertile elderly and the poor and powerless young.

Sunday, August 10

3:30

Simon, Do you See This Woman?

This session we will turn to Luke's emphasis on Jesus' ministry with and for women.

Sunday, August 17

3:30

Parables from the Underside

We'll consider Jesus' parables and how often Jesus makes sinners the heroes and religious hypocrites the villains.

Sunday, August 31

3:30

On the Journey to Jerusalem

In Luke, Jesus' journey to Jerusalem takes up nearly half of the gospel and concludes with, "the Son of Man came to seek and save the lost."

Sunday, September 7

3:30

The Final Week

We'll turn to the events of Holy Week beginning with Jesus entering Jerusalem "humble and riding on a donkey."

Sunday, September 14

3:30

Crucified with the Outlaws

In words that only Luke records, Jesus prays for forgiveness of his abusers, offers salvation to an outlaw, and entrusts his life into his Father's hands.

Each session should last approximately 90 minutes and it is my prayer that as we see Jesus' concern for those who were considered unimportant, we will hear a hopeful and inspiring word for our lives today.
